

African-American Asthma Statistics

- From 2001-2003, about 3,121,000 African-Americans reported that they currently have asthma.¹
- Compared with white children, black children have a 260% higher ED visit rate, a 250% higher hospitalization rate, and a 500% higher death rate from asthma.²
- Through 2005, black children had an asthma prevalence rate 60% higher than white children.²
- African-Americans were three to four times more likely than whites to be hospitalized for asthma, and were four to six times more likely to die from asthma.³
- African-American women have the highest asthma mortality rate of all groups, more than 2.5 times higher than Caucasian women.³
- Non-Hispanic blacks had an asthma attack prevalence about 30% higher than non-Hispanic whites.⁴
- Asthma is 26% more common in African-American children than in white children.⁵
- African-Americans are five times more likely to seek care at an emergency room for asthma than Caucasians.⁶
- Insured African-Americans with asthma are more likely than insured whites to be hospitalized for asthma-related health conditions and are less likely to be treated by an asthma specialist.⁷
